OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE

WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD

SEPTEMBER 9, 2014

The reconvened and adjourned meeting of the County Board of Washington County, Illinois was held at the courthouse in Nashville, Illinois on September 9, 2014 for the purpose of transacting county business that might come before the board.

Present and presiding were Chairman David Meyer and Thomas Ganz, County Clerk and Clerk of the Board.

Others present were Jim Dalaviras, Alex Haglund, Mitch Burdick, Linda Tragesser, Tyson Cole, Heath Hooks, Clint Dolillet, James Pelczynski, Monica Griffith, Rick Greten, Ronda Groennert, Keri Garrett and Brian Guthrie.

Following the Lord's Prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance, Chairman Meyer called the meeting of the Washington County Board to order at 7:10pm.

Roll call was taken by Clerk Ganz with 15 members present and 0 absent. Those present were Hohlt, Spenner, Ibendahl, Shubert, Riechmann, Barczewski, Brammeier, Gill, Muenter, Lisk, Suedmeyer, Evans, Todd, Kurwicki and Meyer.

Chairman Meyer asked if there were any corrections to the minutes of the August 12, 2014 meeting. With no corrections a motion was made by Kur5wicki and seconded by Hohlt to accept the minutes as presented. Motion carried.

Mitch Burdick, County Engineer, gave his monthly report. Burdick on behalf of the Road & Bridge Committee presented a Federal Participation Funding Agreement to the board for a bridge replacement on County Hwy. 11 in Hoyleton Township. A motion was made by Suedmeyer and seconded by Muenter to accept the agreement as presented. Motion carried.

The Claims Against the County Report was presented to the board for approval.

TO THE CHAIRMAN AND MEMBERS OF THE BOARD: YOUR COMMITTEE ON SEPTEMBER 8, 2014 EXAMINED ALL CLAIMS PRESENTED AND RECOMMENDS PAYMENT TO THE FOLLOWING AND THE CLERK BE DIRECTED TO USSUE ORDERS ON THE COUNTY TREASURER TO THE CLAIMANTS FOR THE AMOUNTS ALLOWED. (See Exhibit A) A motion was made by Riechmann and seconded by Brammeier to accept the claims as presented. Roll call vote was taken with 15 ayes and 0 nays. Motion carried.

The State's Attorney Monthly Report was presented to the board. (See Exhibit B) A motion was made by Gill and seconded by Todd to accept the report. Motion carried.

The County Clerk & Recorder's Monthly Report was presented to the board for approval. (See Exhibit C) A motion was made by Spenner and seconded by Lisk to accept the report as presented. Motion carried.

The Sheriff's Monthly Report was presented to the board. (See Exhibit D) A motion was made by Riechmann and seconded by Hohlt to accept the report as presented. Motion carried.

The Emergency Ambulance and Rescue Service Monthly Report was presented to the board for approval. (See Exhibit E) A motion was made by Shubert and seconded by Muenter to accept the report as presented. Motion carried.

An ordinance authorizing an addendum to Mutual Aid Box Alarm System Agreement (ORDINANCE #014-12) was presented to the board for approval. (See Exhibit F) A motion was made by Shubert and seconded by Spenner to accept the addendum as presented. Roll call vote was taken with 15 ayes and 0 nays. Motion carried.

Zoning Request #006-14 – Monica Griffith – Ordinance to amend zoning map – (ORDINANCE #014-13) rezone 3.9 acres from Ag. to R-1 for rural residential uses. (See Exhibit G) A motion was made by Gill and seconded by Evans to accept the request as presented. Roll call vote was taken with 15 ayes and 0 nays. Motion carried.

Zoning Request #004-14 – David Droste – Ordinance for special use permit – (ORDINANCE #014-14) for a pole barn construction to house an agriculture seed sales agency. (See Exhibit H) A motion was made by Riechmann and seconded by Ibendahl to accept the request as presented. Roll call vote was taken with 15 ayes and 0 nays. Motion carried.

Zoning Request #005-14 - Clint Dodillet - Ordinance for special use permit - the operation of a micro-distillery and storage of distilled spirits. Chairman Meyer asked that the board move to table the request until a license and ordinance can be drawn up by the State's Attorney. A motion was made by Shubert and seconded by Spenner that the request be tabled. Motion carried.

Zoning Request #006-14-James Pelczynski - Ordinance for special use permit - (ORDINANCE #014-15) the location of a modular home with underpinning in an R-2 district. (See Exhibit I) A motion was made by Brammeier and seconded by Suedmeyer to accept the request as presented. Motion carried.

Ronda Groennert, County Treasurer, gave her last quarterly report to the board before she retires. She told the board that there is \$20,364,932 in taxes to be collected this year. That is over a million dollars more then what was collected last year. The installment dates for taxes are October 19, 2014 and December 7, 2014.

Keri Garrett, Regional Superintendent of Schools, addressed the board. Garrett presented the board with handouts of yearly activities that her office has performed the past year. She also told the board that all grants have been received but some amounts have been lowered. She told the board that our region as received a Pre-K a compliance award, the Gold Level Award, which is the high award that can be received. She said it has taken 8 years to accomplish this.

A resolution, #002-14, was presented to the board for acceptance congratulating the staff and administration of the Warren G. Murray Developmental Center. (See Exhibit J) A motion was made by Ibendahl and seconded by Gill to accept the resolution as presented. Motion carried.

At this time Chairman Meyer called for committee reports.

Finance Committee – Suedmeyer presented a resolution, #003-14, to the board authorizing the vice chairman of the Washington County Board to enter into an agreement for the purchase of electricity for the county's municipal electricity aggregation program. (See Exhibit K) A motion was made by Ibendahl and seconded by Brammeier to accept the resolution and appoint Suedmeyer as the contact person. Motion carried.

Personnel, Policy & Appointments Committee — Shubert told the board that the person who had submitted his name last month for consideration to the Washington County Hospital Board has since withdrew his name and how there are 3 open seats on the board.

Riechmann made a motion that there should no longer be a 30 day waiting period to the Hospital Board once the name is submitted. The appointment should be approved or denied at the time the name is presented. A second to the motion was made by Hohlt. Motion carried.

Greg Kessler has resigned from the Zoning Board of Appeals and the name of Patricia Rensing was submitted to fill his unexpired term. Shubert moved and Muenter seconded to accept the name as presented. Motion carried. The term will run from September 9, 2014 thru November 11, 2016.

County Buildings - Suedmeyer told the board that the start date for the courthouse renovation has been moved from January to March.

The board was informed that a new security program will have to be installed on the county computers. The cost will be \$8,143.53. A motion was made by Brammeier and seconded by Barczewski to proceed with the install. Motion carried.

A bill from Miken Tech. was submitted to the board. Miken put in about 200 hours installing new computers and installing Windows XP. Riechmann made a motion to table paying the bill until the board can meet with Miken to discuss the hours. A second to the motion was made by Lisk. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Suedmeyer and seconded by Evans to pay all bills, payroll, overtime, utilities and insurance. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Todd and seconded by Kurwicki to adjourn until October 14, 2014 at 8:00pm. Motion carried. The meeting of the Washington County Board adjourned at 8:30pm.

MUTUAL AID BOX ALARM SYSTEM FIRST ADDENDUM TO MABAS MASTER AGREEMENT

This First Addendum to the Mutual Aid Box Alarm System ("MABAS") Master Agreement in the State of Illinois, last amended prior to 2000, is meant to incorporate in its entirety the terms included within the Master Agreement except as specifically changed herein. In the event there is a conflict between the terms and conditions of the Master Agreement and this Addendum, this Addendum shall be controlling.

As the cost of lending mutual aid support has increased in recent times, communities have determined it necessary to agree in advance on cost reimbursement issues prior to the occurrence of an actual emergency. Mutual aid agreements such as the MABAS Master Agreement have served as the foundation for navigating cost issues and engaging in these agreements prior to the emergency avoid post-emergency concerns on cost reimbursement.

SECTION FIVE - Compensation for Aid is amended to read as follows:

Equipment, personnel, and/or services provided to this Agreement shall be at no charge to the party requesting aid for the first eight (8) consecutive hours of aid provided to the Stricken Unit; however, any expenses recoverable from third parties shall be equitably distributed among responding parties. Day to day mutual aid should remain free of charge and the administrative requirements of reimbursement make it unfeasible to charge for day-to-day mutual aid. Nothing herein shall operate to bar any recovery of funds from any state or federal agency under any existing statute.

Any Aiding Unit is empowered to and may charge a Stricken Unit for reimbursement for costs of equipment, personnel, and/or services provided under this Agreement for terms of more than eight (8) consecutive hours under the following terms and conditions:

- The amount of charges assessed by an Aiding Unit to a Stricken Unit may not exceed the amount necessary to make the Aiding Unit whole and should only include costs that are non-routine in nature.
- The Aiding Unit must assess no more the "usual and customary" charges for personnel costs pursuant to a collective bargaining agreement, benefit ordinance or compensation policy.

- 3. The fee structure for apparatus and equipment shall be based on FEMA or OSFM rate schedules. If a particular piece of apparatus or equipment is not listed within the FEMA / OSFM rate schedules, a market rate for reimbursement shall be established.
- 4. In no event shall the amount assessed by an Aiding Unit to a Stricken Unit exceed the amount of fees permitted to be assessed under Illinois law.
- 5. Aiding Units must invoice the Stricken Unit within thirty (30) days after the completion of the emergency; Once thirty (30) days pass, the aid shall be considered to be a donation of service.
- 6. <u>Mutual Aid and assessing costs for mutual aid cannot in any way</u> be conditioned upon any declaration of a federal disaster.

Member Units are encouraged to consider the adoption of Internal policies establishing procedures for cost reimbursement on MABAS mobilizations pursuant to established MABAS procedures for collection and submission of funds.

RESOLUTION NO. 603-14

AUTHORIZING THE VICE CHAIRMAN OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT

FOR THE PURCHASE OF ELECTRICITY FOR THE COUNTY'S MUNICIPAL ELECTRICITY AGGREGATION PROGRAM

WHEREAS, Section 1-92 of the Illinois Power Agency Act, 20 ILCS 3855/1-92 permits a County, if authorized by referendum, to adopt an ordinance by which it may operate a program to solicit bids and enter into service agreements for the purchase of electricity for residential and small commercial customers who do not opt-out of such a program; and WHEREAS, the County of Washington, in a referendum held on

Sept. 9, 20/4, submitted the public question of whether it should operate the program as an opt-out program; and

WHEREAS, the referendum passed by a majority vote of the qualified electors voting on the question; and

WHEREAS, the County finds that the best interests of the residents are served by entering into a contract with the lowest responsible qualified bidder, pursuant to 20 ILCS 3855/1-92, to aggregate the residential and small commercial retail electric loads located within the County and to arrange for competitive electric supply to the retail electrical accounts which do not opt out of said program; and

WHEREAS, the County has engaged in a fair and open process to request proposals for supplying electricity for the future from such certified suppliers; and WHEREAS, to obtain the most competitive price, the process of entering into a contract for the supply of electricity requires the County to accept a proposal within hours after it is submitted, which short-time requires delegation of authority to the Vice Chairman of the Board to enter into a contract.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF THE COUNTY OF WASHINGTON, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1. That the Vice Chairman of the Board, is authorized to execute contracts for and to take such other steps as necessary for the purchase of electricity for County use from a retail electrical supplier for a period of at least 12 months and not more than 36 months if:

- 1) The electricity rate is based on the recommendation of Affordable Gas & Electric, the administer of the bidding process; and
- 2) The rate complies with the Illinois Renewable Energy Portfolio Standards.
