OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD

JUNE 9, 2015

The reconvened and adjourned meeting of the County Board of Washington County, Illinois was held at the Community Center in Nashville, Illinois on June 9, 2015 for the purpose of transacting county business that might come before the board.

Present and presiding were Chairman David Meyer and Nancy Heseman, County Clerk and Clerk of the Board.

Others present were Linda Tragesser, Mitch Burdick, Rick Greten, Kent Ahlers, Jim Dalaviras, Heath Hooks, Alex Haglund, Kelly Cameron, Bill Whitlow and Del Scott

Following the Lord's Prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance, Chairman Meyer called the meeting of the Washington County Board to order at 7:00 p.m.

Roll call was taken by Clerk Heseman with 12 members present and 3 absent. Those present were Muentner, Suedmeyer, Evans, Kurwicki, Hohlt, Spenner, Ibendahl, Shubert, Barczewski, Brammeier, Gill and Meyer. Absent were Todd, Lisk and Bening.

Chairman Meyer asked if there were any corrections to the minutes of the regular scheduled meeting on May 12, 2015. With no corrections, a motion was made by Kurwicki and seconded by Brammeier to accept the minutes as presented. Motion carried.

Mitch Burdick, County Engineer, addressed the Board with updates on County Hwy 11 and Elm Road. Weather permitting, projects might be done by the end of the month. Bridge inspections have been completed.

The Claims against the County Report was presented to the board for approval by Evans.

TO THE CHAIRMAN AND MEMBERS OF THE BOARD: YOUR COMMITTEE ON JUNE 9, 2015 EXAMINED ALL CLAIMS PRESENTED AND RECOMMENDS PAYMENT TO THE FOLLOWING AND THE CLERK BE DIRECTED TO ISSUE ORDERS ON THE COUNTY TREASURER TO THE CLAIMANTS FOR THE AMOUNTS ALLOWED. (See Exhibit A) A motion was made by Evans and seconded by Gill to accept the report as presented. Roll call vote was taken with 12 ayes and 0 nays. Motion carried.

The State's Attorney Monthly Report was presented to the Board. (See Exhibit B) A motion was made by Spenner and seconded by Shubert to accept the report as presented. Motion carried.

The County Clerk & Recorder's Monthly Report was presented to the Board. (See Exhibit C) A motion was made by Hohlt and seconded by Barczewski to accept the report as presented. Motion carried.

Clerk Heseman addressed the board informing them new voter registration cards are being mailed out. With the new type of card this reflects over a \$4000.00 savings, due to the postage and cost of voter cards. Heseman is also considering a change of election vendor with a minimum of a \$5000.00 savings,

and has applied for an \$8000.00 grant. The County Clerk's office is offering direct deposit for county employees pay. Direct deposit is an option for the employees and will take up to 6 weeks to get it implemented. There is no cost to the county for this service and will save the county money.

The Sheriff's Monthly Report was presented to the Board for approval. (See Exhibit D) A motion was made by Evans and seconded by Muentert to accept the report as presented. Motion carried.

The Emergency Ambulance and Rescue Service monthly report as presented to the Board for Approval. (See Exhibit E) A motion was made by Shubert and seconded by Kurwicky to accept the report as presented. Motion carried.

Zoning Request #004-15-Erin Kurtz- Ordinance to amend zoning map – (ORDINANCE #2015-7) to change the Zone District Classification of 2.6 acres in Sec 8 T1S R4W, from Ag to R-1 (Rural Residential) to permit Residential uses. (See Exhibit F) A motion was made by Brammeier and seconded by Barczewski to grant the request presented. Roll call vote was taken with 12 ayes and 0 nays. Motion carried.

Ordinance & Resolution Determining Prevailing Wages was presented to the board for approval. (ORDINANCE 2015-8) (See Exhibit G) A motion was made by Gill and seconded by Hohlt to accept the resolution and ordinance as presented. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION FIXING JUROR COMPENSATION IN AND JURY TRIAL DEMAND FEE IN WASHINGTON COUNTY, ILLINOIS (RESOLUTION #2015-2) (See Exhibit H) A motion was made by Ibendahl and seconded by Spenner to accept resolution as presented. Motion carried.

County Treasurer Cameron appeared before the board reporting the 2015 mobile home tax bills have been mailed out.

Sharon Frederking, Health Department Administrator, appeared before the board explaining the Health Departments Activity Report for December 2014-May 2015. (See Exhibit I)

Gary Suedmeyer, Building Committee Chairman, appeared before the board with **Change of Orders** concerning the renovation of the courthouse.

Change Order for Stair Changes for the amount of \$19,456.00. (See Exhibit J) A motion was made by Brammeier and seconded by Hohlt to accept the Change Order as presented. Motion carried.

Change of Order for Masonry Work for the amount of \$2,251.00. (See Exhibit K) Cost would be \$6,550.00 with a credit of \$4,299.00 with the remaining balance for this change order being \$2,251.00. A motion was made by Brammeier and seconded by Evans to accept the Change of Order as presented. Motion carried.

Change of Order for Roofing Revision for a Credit of \$2,975.00. (See Exhibit L). A motion was made by Ibendahl and seconded by Spenner to accept the Change of Order as presented. Motion carried.

Change of Order for Fire Pump for the amount of \$48,067.00. (See Exhibit M). A motion was made by Spenner and seconded by Hohlt to accept the Change of Order as presented. Motion carried.

Change of Order for Light Pole Receptacles for the amount of \$3,320.00. (See Exhibit N) A motion was made by Hohlt and seconded by Kurwicki to accept the Change of Order as presented. Motion carried.

Building Committee asked for additional funds to be added to the contingency fund for Change Orders, as this could slow down progress and a possible need for special board meetings. A motion was made by Ibendahl and seconded by Hohlt to give the Building Committee access to an additional \$50,000.00. Motion carried.

The Servers in the Jail will need replacing. Trent from Miken thinks the county could wait till the next year budget to replace them.

Finance Committee – Gary Malawy of Krehbiel & Assoc., presented the County Financial Statements (**Audit**) to the board for approval. Malawy told the board that the county had a clean audit and called the board's attention to several different pages of the audit in order to explain the audit in more detail. A motion was made by Suedmeyer and seconded by Barczewski to the audit as presented. Motion carried. NOTE: The full audit is on file in the office of the County Clerk for review.

At this time Chairman Meyer called for committee reports.

Victor Shubert, Chairman of the IBEW union negotiations committee, stated they have met with office holders for a general discussion. Tuesday, June 16, they will be holding their first meeting with the IBEW to start negotiations.

Gary Suedmeyer, Chairman Building Committee, addressed the Decker Water Fountain. A discussion was held to look into something other than the Water Fountain. The Building Committee will look into this some more.

Meyer informed the Board the UCCI Conference will be in July.

A motion was made by Evans and seconded by Muentner to pay all bills, utilities, payroll, overtime and insurance. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Hohlt and seconded by Spenner to adjourn until July 14 at 7:00 p.m. Motion carried. The meeting of the Washington County Board adjourned at 9:00 p.m.

Recitals

The *Prevailing Wage Act*, approved June 26, 1941, as amended (820 ILCS 130/1 *et seq.*) required that County of Washington investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages in said locality for work which is of similar character to that which may be performed by laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in the construction of public works for said County; and

The aforesaid Act requires Washington County to investigate and ascertain said prevailing wages once each year in the month of June; and

Washington County enacted Ordinance No. 2015-8, entitle An Ordinance *Incorporating the Terms of the Prevailing Wage Act*, on June 25, 1993, wherein authority was granted to the Board of the County to enact a resolution each calendar year in order to ascertain the then current prevailing rate of wages which resolution shall supersede the determination provided in said Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CHAIRMAN AND BOARD MEMBERS OF WASHINGTON COUNTY, WASHINGTON COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

SECTION 1. The recitals enumerated above are incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof as though fully set forth herein.

SECTION 2. To the extent and as required by the *Prevailing Wage Act*, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of Washington County, is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in the Washington County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June of the current year. A copy of the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in the Washington County area as determined by the Department of Labor is or will be attached hereto and is incorporated herein by reference. As required by said Act, any and all revisions of the prevailing rate of wages by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois shall supersede the Department's June determination and apply to any and all public works construction

undertaken by the County of Washington. The definition of any terms appearing in this Resolution which are also used in aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 3. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages to any work or employment except public works of said County to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

SECTION 4. The Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of this County this determination or any revisions of such prevailing rate of wages. A copy of this determination or of the current revised determination of prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.

SECTION 5. The Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employers who have filed their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 6. The Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Resolution with the Illinois Department of Labor.

SECTION 7. The Clerk shall cause to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area a Notice stating the Prevailing Wage Resolution has been adopted and such publication shall constitute notice that the determination is effective and that this is the determination of this public body.

WASHINGTON COUNTY

ELECTRICIANS (NORTHWEST) - Township of Venedy.

PLUMBERS & PIPEFITTERS (WEST) - That part of the county West of a line 2.5 miles East of Rt. 127 including the towns of Posin, Beacoup and New Minden.

PLUMBERS & PIPEFITTERS (EAST) - That part of the county East of a North-South line 2.5 miles East of Rt. 127.

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and Veterans Day in some classifications/counties. Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

Oil and chip resealing (O&C) means the application of road oils and liquid asphalt to coat an existing road surface, followed by application of aggregate chips or gravel to coated surface, and subsequent rolling of material to seal the surface.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and hazardous materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

CERAMIC TILE FINISHER AND MARBLE FINISHER

The handling, at the building site, of all sand, cement, tile, marble or stone and all other materials that may be used and installed by (a) tile layer or marble mason. In addition, the grouting, cleaning, sealing, and mixing on the job site, and all other work as required in assisting the setter. The term "Ceramic" is used for naming the classification only and is in no way a limitation of the product handled. Ceramic takes into consideration most hard tiles.

ELECTRONIC SYSTEMS TECHNICIAN

Installation, service and maintenance of low-voltage systems which utilizes the transmission and/or transference of voice, sound, vision, or digital for commercial, education, security and entertainment purposes for the following: TV monitoring and surveillance, background/foreground music, intercom and telephone interconnect, field programming, inventory control systems, microwave transmission, multi-media, multiplex, radio page, school, intercom and sound burglar alarms and low voltage master clock systems.

Excluded from this classification are energy management systems, life safety systems, supervisory controls and data acquisition systems not intrinsic with the above listed systems, fire alarm systems, nurse call systems and raceways exceeding fifteen feet in length.

SURVEY WORKER - Operated survey equipment including data collectors, G.P.S. and robotic instruments, as well as conventional levels and transits.

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

Class 1. Drivers on 2 axle trucks hauling less than 9 ton. Air compressor and welding machines and brooms, including those pulled by separate units, truck driver helpers, warehouse employees, mechanic helpers, greasers and tiremen, pickup trucks when hauling materials, tools, or workers to and from and on-the-job site, and fork lifts up to 6,000 lb. capacity.

Class 2. Two or three axle trucks hauling more than 9 ton but hauling less than 16 ton. A-frame winch trucks, hydrolift trucks, vactor trucks or similar equipment when used for transportation purposes. Fork lifts over 6,000 lb. capacity, winch trucks, four axle combination units, and ticket writers.

Class 3. Two, three or four axle trucks hauling 16 ton or more. Drivers on water pulls, articulated dump trucks, mechanics and working forepersons, and dispatchers. Five axle or more combination units.

Class 4. Low Boy and Oil Distributors.

Class 5. Drivers who require special protective clothing while employed on hazardous waste work. Jurisdiction in Bond, Calhoun, Clinton, Fayette, Greene, Jefferson, Jersey, Macoupin, Madison, Marion, Monroe, Montgomery, Perry, Randolph, St. Clair, and Washington.

TRUCK DRIVER - OIL AND CHIP RESEALING ONLY.

This shall encompass laborers, workers and mechanics who drive contractor or subcontractor owned, leased, or hired pickup, dump, service, or oil distributor trucks. The work includes transporting materials and equipment (including but not limited to, oils, aggregate supplies, parts, machinery and tools) to or from the job site; distributing oil or liquid asphalt and aggregate; stock piling material when in connection with the actual oil and chip contract. The Truck Driver (Oil & Chip Resealing) wage classification does not include supplier delivered materials.

TERRAZZO FINISHER

The handling of all materials used for Mosaic and Terrazzo work including preparing, mixing by hand, by mixing machine or transporting of pre-mixed materials and distributing with shovel, rake, hoe, or pail, all kinds of concrete foundations necessary for Mosaic and Terrazzo work, all cement terrazzo, magnesite terrazzo, Do-O-Tex terrazzo, epoxy matrix ter-razzo, exposed aggregate, rustic or rough washed for exterior or interior of buildings placed either by machine or by hand, and any other kind of mixture of plastics composed of chips or granules when mixed with cement, rubber, neoprene, vinyl, magnesium chloride or any other resinous or chemical substances used for seamless flooring systems, and all other building materials, all similar materials and all precast terrazzo work on jobs, all scratch coat used for Mosaic and Terrazzo work and sub-bed, tar paper and wire mesh (2x2 etc.) or lath. The rubbing, grinding, cleaning and finishing of same either by hand or by machine or by terrazzo

resurfacing equipment on new or existing floors. When necessary finishers shall be allowed to assist the mechanics to spread sand bed, lay tarpaper and wire mesh (2x2 etc.) or lath. The finishing of cement floors where additional aggregate of stone is added by spreading or sprinkling on top of the finished base, and troweled or rolled into the finish and then the surface is ground by grinding machines.

Other Classifications of Work:

For definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and provide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist by reference in this document. If no neighboring county rate applies to the task, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination. If a project requires these, or any classification not listed, please contact IDOL at 217-782-1710 for wage rates or clarifications.

LANDSCAPING

Landscaping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape plantsman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck driver.

RESOLUTION FIXING JUROR COMPENSATION IN AND JURY TRIAL DEMAND FEE
IN WASHINGTON COUNTY, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority of the Counties Codes Act, 55 ILCS 5/4-11001, the Code of Civil Procedure, 735 ILCS 5/2-1105 as amended, and previous County Board Resolution, the Circuit Clerk presently assesses and collects from the requesting litigant a fee for civil jury trial demands, and provides that the County Board compensates grand and petit jurors for their services, as designated by the above-referenced Acts, as well as payment of travel expense to grand and petit jurors; and

WHEREAS, the Counties Codes Act has been amended (Public Act 98-1132), effective June 1, 2015, mandating each county to pay to grand and petit jurors for their services, the sums of \$25.00 for the first day and thereafter \$50.00 for each day of necessary attendance, or such higher amount as may be fixed by the County Board; and

WHEREAS, the County Board has previously authorized the payment of travel expense to the jurors and the same is no longer required by State Statute;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of the County of Washington, that the fee to be paid by the County of Washington to grand and petit jurors for their services in attending courts the sums of \$25.00 for the first day and thereafter \$50.00 for each day of necessary attendance with no reimbursement for travel expense.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the County Board of the County of Washington, that the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Washington County is hereby authorized and directed to charge and collect a fee of \$200.00 for a civil jury trial demand, said fee to be collected from the first requesting party in each civil jury trial demand case as provided by 705 ILCS 105/27.1a(s).
