**January 14, 2025**

The reconvened and adjourned meeting of the County Board of Washington County, Illinois was held at the Washington County Courthouse Nashville, Illinois on Tuesday, January 14, 2025 for the purpose of transacting county business that might come before the Board.

Present and presiding were Chairman David Meyer and Shari Hempfen, County Clerk and Clerk of the Board.

Chairman Meyer asked if there were any additions or corrections to the December 2, 2024 reorganizational meeting minutes. With no additions or corrections, a motion was made by Shemonic seconded by Small to approve the minutes as presented. Motion carried

Chairman Meyer asked if there were any additions or corrections to the December 10, 2024 Board meeting minutes. With no additions or corrections, a motion was made by Brammeier to approve the minutes, seconded by Hohlt. Motion carried.

Washington County Coroner, Mark Styninger 2024 Annual Report was presented to the Board. (Informational only) **(Exhibit A)**

Kiefer Heiman – County Highway Engineer presented four (4) Resolutions to the Board for approval.

Resolution #2025-72 **(Exhibit B)** to replace a failing drainage structure on TR135, Richview Road, Beaucoup Road District, West of Alabama Road, Section 7, T2S, R2W.

Resolution #2025-73 **(Exhibit C)** to replace a failing drainage structure on TR135, Richview Road, Beaucoup Road District, South of Alabama Road, Section 18, T2S, R2W.

Resolution #2025-74 **(Exhibit D)** to replace a failing drainage structure on TR135, Richview Road, Beaucoup Road District, East of Alabama Road, Section 9, T2S, R2W.

A motion was made by Bening seconded by Unverfehrt to approve the resolutions as presented. Malick abstained from the motion, he is the road commissioner for Beaucoup Twp. Motion carried

**The Claims against the County Report** was presented to the Board for approval by Ibendahl. **TO THE CHAIRMAN AND MEMBERS OF THE BOARD: YOUR COMMITTEE MET ON January 13, 2025 EXAMINED ALL CLAIMS PRESENTED AND RECOMMENDS PAYMENT TO THE FOLLOWING AND THE CLERK BE DIRECTED TO ISSUE ORDER ON THE**

COUNTY TREASURER TO THE CLAIMANTS FOR THE AMOUNTS ALLOWED. **(Exhibit F)** Seconded by Shemonic roll call vote was taken with 11 ayes. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ibendahl seconded by Small to make restitution to the County Board's Per Diems. Roll Call vote was taken with 11 ayes. Motion carried.

**The State's Attorney's Monthly Report (Exhibit G)** Dan Janowski appeared before the Board to present his report to the board. Ibendahl made a motion to accept the report as presented seconded by Small. Motion carried. Janowski told the board it was his last board meeting as the County's State's Attorney. He said he has enjoyed working with the Board as their attorney. He wanted to thank all the office heads and anyone he worked with during his time here. Chairman Meyer told Janowski he appreciated all the legal counsel he did for the County and that his leaving is a big loss for the county.

**The County Clerk and Recorder's Monthly Report (Exhibit H)** Clerk Hempen presented her monthly report to the Board for approval a motion was made by Bening seconded by Hohlt to approve the report as presented.

A motion was made by Brammeier seconded by Luna to accept the resolutions as presented. Motion carried.

**The Sheriff's Monthly Report** Informational handout included. **(Exhibit P)** Sheriff Schultze appeared before the board to present the Sheriff's Department monthly report. A motion was made by Shemonic seconded by Hohlt to accept the reports as presented. Motion carried.

Resolution, establishing a maximum number of Sheriff's Deputies in Washington County. This resolution was tabled from the December 10, 2024 County Board meeting.

Chairman Meyer asked Sheriff Schultze if he had any comments on the hiring an additional deputy. **(See Exhibit Q)**

Chairman Meyer said he will allow someone to speak for the group. No one contacted him about being put on the agenda and he will not allow everyone getting up and down, so one person will speak on their behalf. That is protocol and the way it has been in the past.

Unverfehrt Chairman of the Sheriff's Committee said the committee has discussed this quite a bit and there is not enough money in the budget at this time to add an additional deputy. There are some dollars between the drug fund and money that has been confiscated. Unverfehrt said that is not yearly and does not know if that will continue from year to year most likely will, but not a set number. Unverfehrt made a motion to accept the resolution to add an additional deputy. Seconded by Luna-Fuller. Roll call vote was requested by Unverfehrt roll call vote was taken with 4 ayes and 7 nays. Voting aye were Bronke, Luna-Fuller, Shemonic and Unverfehrt. Voting nay were Hohlt, Ibendahl, Malick, Small, Bening, Brammeier and Meyer. Absent were Karg, Klingenberg and Todd. Resolution failed.

**The Ambulance Monthly Report (Exhibit R)** Felchlia appeared before the board to present his monthly report. A motion was made by Brammeier seconded by Hohlt to approve the report as presented. Motion carried. An open house for the new Ambulance Facility is tentatively planned for the 3<sup>rd</sup> week in May to coincide with National EMS week.

An Amendment to the 2023-15 Public Safety (Ambulance Fees) was presented to the Board (**Exhibit S**). Every 2 years the county looks at their fee rates and adds inflation to those rates to keep it regulated. This is done on the odd years. The only way the ambulance department can generate revenue is through their rates and tax levy. It takes about 3 months before you see the revenue increase. Small said the Ambulance committee recommends the increase and to amend the ordinance seconded by Luna-Fuller. Roll call vote was taken with 11 ayes and 0 nays. Motion carried.

The individual must understand the information provided here will not result in any type of preferential treatment to the individual and that the Washington County Sheriff's Office nor any other responding agencies will not be held liable for duties relating to the reporting of special needs individuals.

I also understand that if any of the above information changes, I must notify the Washington County Sheriff's Office by filing an amended request form. The information will self expire in 2 (two) years from the date received by the Sheriff's Office and I must renew the form if I want the information kept in the Sheriff's Office CAD Database.

#### TRAFFIC DETAIL ON US HWY 51 RESULTS IN DUI ARREST

On December 7, 2024 around 930 PM, Deputies with the Washington County Sheriff's Office conducted a traffic detail on US Highway 51 when a car traveling southbound on Highway 51 passed Deputy Klingeman's patrol car at 120 mph. Deputy Klingeman activated his warning lights and audible sirens in an attempt to stop the vehicle. The vehicle would not stop and continued southbound over 100 mph weaving in and out of traffic. The driver tried to enter the westbound I64 on the ramp at a high rate of speed, but the vehicle overshot the ramp and crashed into the grassy area. Deputy Klingeman and Sgt. Lemons got the driver out of the car and noticed the driver appeared impaired and smelled of alcoholic beverage. The driver was arrested for speeding 35+ over the posted speed limit, aggravated fleeing, and DUI. Over this holiday season, deputies will be out in force combating aggressive drivers, and impaired drivers. The goal of the Sheriff's Office is to keep the community it serves safe. Our enforcement goal is for everyone to have a safe holiday season.

#### BUSY WEEKEND FOR OUR DEPUTIES

On Saturday, December 20th, Deputy Klingeman made an arrest on US Highway 51. The driver was traveling approximately 115 MPH. When Deputy Klingeman and Sgt. Lemons finally got the vehicle stopped, they found cannabis in the driver's compartment. The driver was arrested for driving 35 mph over the posted speed limit and possession of cannabis. Cannabis is legal in Illinois, but you still need to be of age, and transport it in a sealed odorless container.

On Sunday, December 21, Deputy Vincent made a traffic stop that led to a DUI arrest. The driver was initially stopped for no valid registration. While conducting his investigations Deputy Vincent noticed signs of impairment. Deputy Vincent conducted a field sobriety test on the driver and determined the driver was impaired. The driver submitted to breathe analysis and the driver blew a .181 with .08 being the legal limit. The driver was more than two times the legal limit. The driver was issued citations and a court date. The driver was also charged with driving with no valid registration and DUI.

Later that morning while responding to a call, Deputy Vincent was passed by a vehicle traveling east on I-64. Deputy Vincent's in-car radar showed the vehicle traveling 106 MPH. Deputy Vincent conducted a traffic stop. The driver stated he wasn't paying attention to his speed. The driver was arrested for class A misdemeanor speed and issued a court date.

These highlights are just a part of the deputy's busy weekend. With the New Year just days away we remind you that deputies will continue to be out keeping the public as safe as possible. A DUI is costly and may have serious consequences. Please drive safe and drive sober, your life and those around you are worth more.

- Requesting an additional Deputy to provide additional law enforcement capabilities to the citizens of Washington County.
- The additional Deputy would allow for more coverage and additional safety for citizens and deputies.
- The additional deputy would help to reduce response times to calls for service.
- The additional Deputy would provide more coverage to the towns that no longer have a Police Department.
- Call Volume has increased by 2008 calls since 2022 according to ID Networks.
- The budget line item for deputy salaries was computed with the additional deputy accounted for. This budgeted amount was computed prior to the authorization of the \$2.00 an hour raise that was approved by the Washington County Board for the deputies. This will be an additional cost of approximately \$41,600.00.
- We are two correctional officers under what was budgeted for. These correctional officers will not be replaced until the jail renovations are complete. This will save the Sheriff's Office approximately \$49,441.00 from the correctional officer budget line.
- During the jail renovations overtime will be minimized to save additional money from the correctional officer budget line.
- Sheriff Schultze agreed to pay for the yearly new vehicle from the WCSO drug fund, if another deputy is authorized. This will save \$53,352 out of the sheriff's office replacement vehicle budget line. This is the cost of the vehicle that is scheduled to be delivered on 01/17/2024.
- The budget line item for deputy salary is \$729,000.
- The cost for 10 deputies at their current salary is \$580,818. With 10% overtime the cost would be approximately \$639,628.
- The cost of an additional deputy is included with this memorandum.

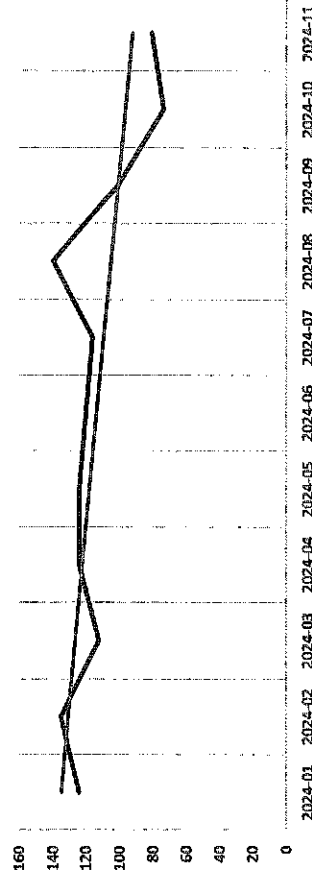

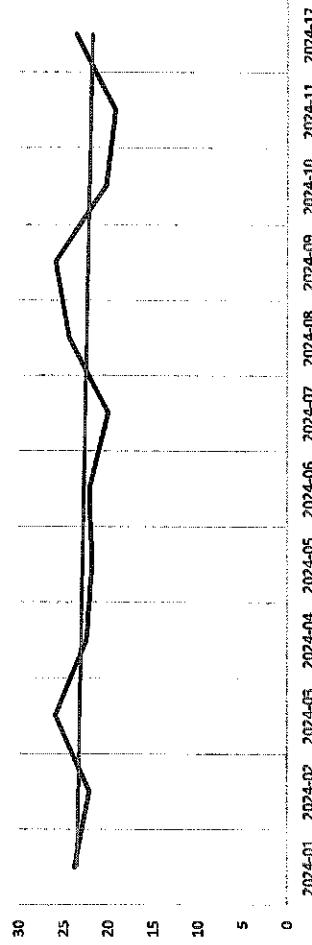



**AGREEMENT CONCERNING APPOINTMENT OF  
WASHINGTON COUNTY STATE'S ATTORNEY**

**WHEREAS**, Daniel Janowski was elected Washington County State's Attorney in the General Election of 2024, with his term as State's Attorney to run from December 1, 2024, through November 30, 2028; and

**WHEREAS**, Daniel Janowski resigned as Washington County State's Attorney effective January 30, 2025, creating a vacancy in the office of Washington County State's Attorney, which vacancy occurred with more than twenty-eight (28) months remaining in the term of said office; and

**WHEREAS**, 10 ILCS 5/25-11 provides, in relevant part, that if a vacancy occurs in an elective office with more than twenty-eight (28) months remaining in the term of that office, the chairman of the county board shall fill the vacancy by appointment, with the appointee to serve "until the next general election at which time the vacated office shall be filled by election for the remainder of the term" of that office; and

**WHEREAS**, the position of Washington County State's Attorney is a salaried position not subject to the rules or entitlements of the collective bargaining agreement that governs the employment of many Washington County employees; and

**WHEREAS**, the chairman of the Washington County Board, David Meyer, has appointed Crystal May as Washington County State's Attorney to serve until the position is filled after the next general election, said term being through November 30, 2026; and

**WHEREAS**, Crystal May is currently an employee of Washington County, IL, serving as Assistant State's Attorney, and has accrued many employee benefits during her employment which she and Washington County intend to negotiate prior to her leaving employment to be appointed as the Washington County State's Attorney.

**NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, this Agreement is made and entered into by and between CRYSTAL MAY (hereinafter referred to as "MAY") and WASHINGTON COUNTY, ILLINOIS, (hereinafter referred to as the "COUNTY"). The parties hereto agree as follows:

1. The COUNTY agrees to appoint MAY and MAY agrees to serve as Washington County State's Attorney (hereinafter referred to as the "POSITION") until after the next general election, said term being through and including but not to exceed November 30, 2026.

2. The parties agree and understand that the POSITION shall be a salaried, non-union position and that the POSITION's responsibilities shall be any and all duties and requirements necessary to effectuate the responsibilities of the office of County State's Attorney as set forth by Illinois statute.

3. The salary for the POSITION shall be the annual salary paid to the elected State's Attorney of Washington County for the remainder of the vacated term of office. The salary for 2025 shall be prorated to reflect a start date of January 31, 2025.

Additionally, MAY shall be entitled to benefits consistent with those provided to Washington County elected officials at the time of her start date.



4. During her employment with Washington County, MAY has accrued twenty-one (21) personal hours and one hundred ninety-seven (197) paid leave hours for which she is entitled to compensation as of January 31, 2025. MAY agrees to forfeit and waive any claim to personal, sick, vacation, or paid leave time in excess of these amounts, including but not limited to any time so accrued during years prior to 2025. MAY and the COUNTY specifically acknowledge that MAY has accrued four hundred ninety (490) sick hours, for which she does not seek compensation from the COUNTY, but which will continue to be tracked and reported by the COUNTY as a courtesy to MAY only for IMRF purposes upon her retirement.

5. MAY may be terminated at any time by the COUNTY for just cause or for dereliction of duty in accordance with Illinois law in effect at the time of reference.

6. By execution hereof, MAY and the COUNTY agree that MAY's final day of employment as Assistant State's Attorney of Washington County will be January 30, 2025, and her first day as State's Attorney of Washington County will be January 31, 2025.

7. Throughout the duration of her service in the POSITION, MAY shall remain a resident of Washington County.
