OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD MEETING JULY 11, 2023

The reconvened and adjourned meeting of the County Board of Washington County, Illinois was held at the Washington County Courthouse Nashville, Illinois on July 11, 2023 for the purpose of transacting county business that might come before the Board.

Present and presiding were Chairman David Meyer and Shari Hempen, County Clerk and Clerk of the Board.

Others present were Sheriff Ross Schultze, Dan Janowski-State's Attorney, Kiefer Heiman-Highway Supervisor, Todd Marver-Nashville News, Andrea Renken-Circuit Clerk, Matt Bierman- EMA, Dee Demoss- Nashville Chamber of Commerce, Natalie Shook-United Way of South Central Illinois, Debby Stricker- Okawville Times,

Following the Lord's Prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance, Chairman Meyer called the meeting of the Washington County Board to order at 7:05 p.m.

Roll Call was taken by Clerk Hempen with 14 members present and 1 absent. Those present were Bening, Brammeier, Hohlt, Ibendahl, Bronke, Klingenberg, Todd, Shemonic, Small, Suedmeyer, Unverfehrt, Karg, Muenter and Meyer. Absent was Lamczyk

Chairman Meyer asked if there were any additions or corrections to the minutes of the Regular County Board Meeting held on June 13, 2023. With no additions or corrections, a motion was made by Shemonic and seconded by Muenter to approve the minutes as presented. Motion carried.

Circuit Clerk-Andrea Renken appeared before the board with her 6 month report. (See Exhibit A) she also wanted to mention to the Board that she is fully staffed, herself and 3 deputies. One project that they need to get going on is their self-help center they are required to have set up for the general public. This self-help center is where the public can do research and e-file documents. Renken said they have turned an Attorney/Client room in the help center. She has applied for Access to Justice Improvement Grant to help fund the room.

Matt Bierman- EMA Director appeared before the board to give an update on his office. He told the board that the first 6 months of the year his office has been busy. A volunteer group has been created and is up and running. The group has been assisting the Sheriff's department with traffic control, this frees up the deputies to do their work. He has been busy with the recent storms that passed through the County on June 30. The Sheriff's department has donated to EMA one vehicle so far and a second one that we are waiting for the title. IEMA has recently changed their name to IEMA/Homeland Security. Bierman told the Board that today he had received the Gubernatorial Disaster Proclamation from the Governor for Washington County. (See Exhibit B)

Kiefer Heiman, County Engineer, had no resolutions for the month. Heiman said that the county had quite a few trees down with only a few road closures. The road closures were due to downed power lines, some were tangled in with the trees.

The Claims against the County Report was presented to the Board for approval by Ibendahl. TO THE CHAIRMAN AND MEMBERS OF THE BOARD: YOUR COMMITTEE ON July 10, 2023 EXAMINED ALL CLAIMS PRESENTED AND RECOMMENDS PAYMENT TO THE FOLLOWING AND THE CLERK BE DIRECTED TO ISSUE ORDER ON THE COUNTY TREASURER TO THE CLAIMANTS FOR THE AMOUNTS ALLOWED. (See Exhibit C) Hohlt asked to add to the claims a bill for the purchase of 2 vehicles for the Sheriff's Dept. totaling \$97,030. A motion was made by Ibendahl and seconded by Small to add the bill for the Sheriff's Dept. and to accept the report as presented. Roll call vote was taken with 14 ayes and 1 absent. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ibendahl and seconded by Karg to make restitution to the County Board's Per Diems. Motion carried.

The State's Attorney Monthly Report Janowski appeared before the Board to present his monthly report for approval. (See Exhibit D) A motion was made by Hohlt and seconded by Bening to accept the report as presented. Motion carried.

Janowski presented an Employment agreement for a Victim Advocate/legal Secretary for board approval (See Exhibit E). He told the board that it has been a number of years since the County has had a Victim Advocate. In February he applied for a grant to fund a part time Victim Advocate. After he applied for the grant his secretary left. He decided to combine the legal secretary position with the victim advocate and created a full time position. The grant will pay 45% of her salary and the County will pay the 55% remainder. This grant will renew every year, if it doesn't the position goes back to legal secretary with the salary of that position. A motion was made by Small, seconded by Klingenberg to approve the employment agreement. Motion carried.

The County Clerk and Recorder's Monthly Report Clerk Hempen presented her report to the Board for approval. (See Exhibit F) A motion was made by Suedmeyer and seconded by Brammeier to approve the report as presented. Motion carried. Hempen told the board that her office will be mailing out new Voter Registration cards, per State Statue. This is a purge that has to be done every 2 years. She also told the board that she is finished with tax extension and has passed it over to the Treasurer's Office.

The Sheriff's Monthly Report Sheriff Schultze presented his report to the Board for approval (See Exhibit G). A motion was made by Muenter and seconded by Shemonic to approve the report as presented. Motion carried. Sheriff Schultze informed the board that he has hired 3 part time Correctional Officers. The Sheriff's department will be purchasing a transport van at no cost to the taxpayers. The money will come out of the Commissary funds. Sheriff Schultze told the board that they have been using old squad cars with 160-170 miles on them to transport. Friday June 30th there were 6 extra deputies called after the storm hit Washington County. He called out a 4 extra deputies on Saturday. During the power outage the generator in the jail did not work. 911 received 77 calls that Friday night.

The Emergency Ambulance and Rescue Service Monthly Report (See Exhibit H) a motion was made by Hohlt and seconded by Todd to approve the report as presented. Motion carried.

The Treasurer's Monthly Cash Flow Statement and Budgetary status Reports for Period ending 06/30/2023 (See (See Exhibits I & J). A motion was made by Bening seconded by Brammeier to accept the report as presented subject to audit review. Motion carried. Also included was the ARPA Fund recap (Informational Only) (See Exhibit K).

IN THE OFFICE OF SECRETARY OF STATE

GUBERNATORIAL DISASTER PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, beginning June 29, 2023, and continuing through July 4, 2023, several rounds of severe storms passed through Illinois producing heavy rainfall, flash flooding, hail, tornadoes, and straight-line winds threatening lives and causing widespread damage and destruction to public and private property; and,

WHEREAS, on June 29th, central Illinois experienced a derecho that brought damaging straight-line winds resulting in five (5) confirmed tornadoes, along with wind gusts in excess of 100 miles per hour across multiple counties; and,

WHEREAS, the tornados and straight-line winds resulted in large debris fields. affecting homeowners, businesses, utilities, and local governments; and

WHEREAS, due to the significant number of downed trees, branches, and power poles, widespread power outages to homes and businesses occurred; and,

WHEREAS, on June 30th, a second wave of severe storms in southwest Illinois produced damaging winds, hail, and rain resulting in additional widespread power outages and a significant amount of debris across multiple counties; and,

WHEREAS, on July 2nd, a third set of severe storms dropped significant rainfall, including localized totals of upwards of eight (8) inches of water, in a short period of time, causing flash flooding in and around the Chicago area, including on the City's west side in Austin and other communities; and,

WHEREAS, the July 2nd storms also downed numerous trees and caused widespread power outages in northern Illinois; and,

WHEREAS, the storms during this time period also caused disruptions to transportation due to flash flooding and debris on the roadways; and,

WHEREAS, the continuation of severe storms throughout this time period caused further damage to public and private property in the affected areas and inhibited the ability of areas affected by previous storms to undertake effective response and recovery operations; and,

WHEREAS, high temperatures and humidity throughout the entire period, including during and after these storm systems, have required the opening of shelters and public places in order to protect the public from heat-related injuries; and,

WHEREAS, as a result of these storms, the damage they caused to critical infrastructure, and the ongoing danger and impacts to the public, extraordinary measures are required, and have been implemented, to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the people of Illinois; and,

WHEREAS, based on reports received by the Illinois Emergency Management Agency and Office of Homeland Security, local resources and capabilities in the communities hit by these storms have been exhausted, and State resources are needed to respond to and recover from the effects of the severe storms; and,

WHEREAS, these conditions provide legal justification under Section 7 of the Illinois Emergency Management Act, 20 ILCS 3305/7, for the issuance of a proclamation of disaster.

NOW, THEREFORE, in the interest of aiding the people of Illinois and the local governments responsible for ensuring public health and safety, I, JB Pritzker, Governor of the State of Illinois, hereby proclaim as follows:

Section 1: Pursuant to the provisions of Section 7 of the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act, 20 ILCS 3305/7, I find that a disaster exists within the State of Illinois and specifically declare Coles, Cook (including the City of Chicago), Edgar, Hancock, McDonough, Morgan, Sangamon, and Washington Counties as disaster areas.

Section 2. The Illinois Emergency Management Agency and Office of Homeland Security is directed to continue implementation of the State Emergency Operations Plan, as it has been doing since June 29th, and to coordinate State resources to support local governments in disaster response and recovery operations.

Section 3. To aid with emergency purchases necessary for response and other emergency powers as authorized by the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act, the provisions of the Illinois Procurement Code and the Illinois Joint Purchasing Act that would in any way prevent, hinder or delay necessary action in coping with the disaster are suspended to the extent they are not required by federal law.

Section 4: This proclamation can facilitate a request for Federal disaster assistance if a complete and comprehensive assessment of damage indicates that effective recovery is beyond the capabilities of the State and affected local governments.

Section 5: This proclamation shall be effective immediately and remain in effect for 30 days.

AGREEMENT CONCERNING VICTIM ADVOCATE/ LEGAL SECRETARY

WHEREAS, State's Attorney's Offices in Illinois are tasked by statute with a number of responsibilities concerning the victims of crimes; and

WHEREAS, Daniel R. Janowski, the Washington County State's Attorney submitted a grant application, with letters of support from the Resident Circuit Judge and members of law enforcement in Washington County to the Illinois Attorney General to fund a Victim Advocate for the State's Attorney's Office; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Attorney General approved the application and provided funds for the establishment of a Victim Advocate in the State's Attorney's Office with the initial grant term beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the State's Attorney's Office has a current opening for a Legal Secretary which is filled by the State's Attorney but funded by Washington County; and

WHEREAS, the State's Attorney has determined that it is in his Office's best interest to combine the Victim Advocate position to the Legal Secretary position.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, this Agreement is made and entered into by and between SHARYN WILKEY (hereinafter referred to as "Wilkey"), Daniel R. Janowski, WASHINGTON COUNTY STATE'S ATTORNEY, (hereinafter referred to as "State's Attorney") and WASHINGTON COUNTY, ILLINOIS, (hereinafter referred to as the "County"). The parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. The State's Attorney agrees to hire Wilkey and Wilkey agrees to serve as the Victim Advocate/Legal Secretary.
- 2. The parties agree and understand that the Position shall be an hourly, non-union, at-will position and that the Position's responsibilities shall be any and all duties assigned by the State's Attorney and particularly those described in the Victim Advocate Grant Application.
- 3. The compensation for the Position shall be \$24.00 per hour and will be funded 45% through grant money provided by the Illinois Attorney General and 55% by the County. If grant money is not available or not renewed, the Position will be fully funded by the County at a rate less than what is listed here. Such hourly pay will be negotiated and determined at that time.
- 4. During her previous employment with Washington County, Wilkey had accrued 59 vacation hours, 97.5 sick hours, and 7 personal hours for which she is entitled as of July 9, 2023. Wilkey agrees to forfeit and waive any claim to personal, sick or vacation time in excess of this amount, including but not limited to any time so accrued during years prior to 2023. Wilkey and the County specifically acknowledge that these hours will remain credited to her and

that she will continue to earn such time in accordance with the Washington County Employee Manual

- 5. Wilkey may be terminated at any time by the State's Attorney at any time in accordance with Illinois law.
- 6. By execution hereof, Wilkey and the County agree that Wilkey's first day as Victim Advocate/Legal Secretary in the State's Attorney's Office will be treated as July 10, 2023.




